We are thrilled to announce that we have been successful in a bid to the BT/BARCLAYS BANK for a top of the range free WiFi system to be installed in the Hall. This will hopefully take place during the next three months (subject to successful survey of the hall).

Coupled with the installation, we shall have the services of the Barclays Bank Eagles team who will run 6 free WiFi sessions for those who want to know more about using the Internet. This will include newcomers to the internet, silver surfers who want to know more and excitingly a course for 7-17 year olds to learn all about coding. There have been a series of

advertisements on the TV showing the Eagles team with children and adults.

BT will pay for the internet service for 2 years and we will then have to fund it ourselves.

We are also looking to open the hall to public use of the WiFi at certain times to enable those who have no access to WiFi to be able to use the internet. We also hope to raise money to purchase one or two laptops for those who have no computer at all.

WiFi in the hall will be of great advantage to users as well, particularly to the doctors' practices who can then access patient information when necessary.

SHARNFORD PRIMARY SCHOOL

We were pleased to welcome 13 children to Sharnford C E Primary School in September. They've all settled in well to their new classes and are now used to the daily routines of our school. Every Friday during our celebration assembly those children who have demonstrated Christian values are presented with a certificate. Parents had the opportunity to visit the school at the start of the term and meet with their child's teacher.

Over the summer holidays we had new gates fitted to the front of the School and additional parking places created. At the beginning of October we took 55 children from the Federation to Beaumanor Hall, Loughborough for a 2 night residential visit. During their stay the children enjoyed taking part in canoeing, climbing, archery and hide and seek in the cellars. We were delighted with the very positive comments from the Beaumanor team about our children's good behaviour and their ability to work with children from another school.

Children in year 5 and 6 had an exciting morning in September when a company called 'Tropical Inc' brought in a number of exotic animals for the children to see and touch. Children in year 1 and 2 are learning all about toys and will be taking part in a session offered by Charnwood Museum to look at a range of replica toys from the past and compare and contrast them with toys of today.

We entered a number of items into the Sharnford Village Show and were delighted that our vase of 5 Marigolds won first prize. We try to continue looking after our garden at

school but if there is anyone in the community who could spare some time to help us with this, it would be extremely appreciated. Please contact the school office (272456) if you're able to help.

Maple class led our Harvest service at the Methodist Church and we collected food for Hinckley Food Bank, as well as filling 11 shoe boxes with tinned food, and small toys which will be sent to children in Eastern Europe. We held a cake and book sale in the school hall and raised £100, this will be split between school and Children in Need. We will again be raising money for Children in Need dressing in yellow or something associated with Pudsy bear. The school council have been selling Poppies on behalf of the Royal British Legion and old clothes are being collected for a charity who sends them to developing countries.

Our PTA held their annual general meeting and invited new members to attend. They discussed what activities to plan for the children this year and how to spend money they had already raised. The PTA play a very important role in the school helping to raise much needed funds for school but also offer wonderful activities for the children to take part in. They are always looking for parents to join, if you wish to do so, please contact the school office.

Elections were held for the school council and 8 children were voted onto the council representing all year groups within the school. The new reception children had their photograph taken by the Hinckley Times and this was included in their 'My First Day at School' supplement. The Local Rock will also be taking a photo of this group which will be included in a future issue. Tempest photography have taken individual and family photographs of all children.

A nursing team from the National Health Services visited school and administered those children in years 1 to 6 who parents gave permission, with the flu vaccine by way of a nasal spray. We are continuing to offer an afterschool multi sports club and football club. The children have received roller hockey training from staff at Midland Roller Arena in Ashby Parva and enjoyed a day at the arena. An afterschool club is now taking part at the arena.

We have a spare piano at School that is not being used, if anyone could make use of it and collect it from School, please contact us.

We would like to thank all parents and members of the community who come in to school and listen to the children read.

SHARNFORD TRAFFIC ACTION GROUP

At our meeting last night (16th November) we had an update on the Speed Monitor. There have been some problems and criticisms about this machine, but they have now been ironed out and it is up in the middle of the village and working properly. This is thanks to our new Speed Monitor Coordinator, Mike Shirley. The data downloaded so far proves that more than 50% of the vehicles passing through Sharnford exceed the 30 mph speed limit. Quite a few doing over 50mph. This makes the zebra crossing a dangerous place. In the next issue we will have figures to show what exactly the situation is.

Looking back through old papers I see that a by-pass was proposed as long ago as 1933, we are still waiting. Although we understand that the by-pass round Sapcote to the M69 is near the top of the Government list of "to do" when money is available.

Meanwhile, we are still working to push the situation here in Sharnford into the notice of those in power. We need more people to get involved, it is for the benefit of the whole village and I am sure many of you will realise the danger the traffic imposes on the children and elderly who live here. Our meetings will be publicised on the notice boards around the village so please, come and see what you can do to help.

BLABY DISTRICT COUNCILLORS REPORT

Outstanding Achievements Awards held at the Marriott hotel in October, again a huge success. Some councillors and Alberto Costa were in attendance plus finalists, friends and family. To see the full list of winners and runners-up visit www.blaby.gov.uk/awards.

Blaby is in the top 10 happy places in the UK.

Corporate Peer Challenge: The Peer challenge is designed to add value to the Council's own performance and improvement plans. The overall messages were that Blaby is a 'great council' with a strong focus on residents and businesses. Our relationship with partners was described as 'brilliant' and we show real partnership working and leadership. This has been a very useful exercise with feedback showing some useful pointers of things that we can do to improve.

Lightbulb. Work is progressing well on 'LIGHTBULB' – a pioneering programme to test out how we can join up Health, Housing and Social Care services for people.

Feel Alive from 65 event/campaign week. The Health and Leisure team held sessions to encourage people to try out a range of different activities in particular events held at Braunstone Civic Centre and the Pavilion, Huncote. Taster activities well supported in Braunstone and a Kurling tournament was held at the Pavilion with 40 people participating, both these events gave good feedback and a new Tia Chi session will be included in the Braunstone centre in due course.

Housebuilder's Forum held in September to build better relationships with developers



and housebuilders. Event well attended ranging from large to smaller companies, good debate and discussions on a number of subjects, good positive feedback from all who attended.

The Chartered Institute of Housing East Midlands Development of the Year Award. OAK COURT – the new 50

unit Extra Care Scheme at Winchester Road in Blaby has been awarded as above. There are 50 self- contained 2 and 3 bedroom flats, 5 of which are reserved for people leaving hospital. Excellent facilities for the ageing population including 24 hour care and support tailored to the individual needs of the residents.

Blaby Together Summit - took place in September with partners from the community of business and education. The new Youth Council, as part of their 'voice' work prepared for their participation at the summit by considering what 'work readiness' is and what is needed for young
