The make-up of Sharnford Parish Council is soon to alter, not so much the current membership of the council, unless we have changes as a result of the forthcoming council elections which take place at the beginning of May. Be sure to vote should there be a contested election, although this seems unlikely as vacancies exist on the current Parish Council.

The Parish Council over the last 12 months has been slowly moving forward and will shortly be appointing a new Parish Clerk, this is one of the

changes that the council have been working on since my report of last year.

One of the projects the Parish Council has been involved with is the Fosse Villages Neighbourhood Plan; this is in its final stages of completion. There will be new challenges with the growing number of distribution centres being built in the area, the newest threat being the planned hub at the M69 island between Sapcote and Hinckley, this will cause more congestion on the roads and possibly affect air quality which is already below standard. An action group has been started which is in its infancy and this will need support from Sharnford Parish Council and the Sharnford Traffic Action Group [STAG]. Look out for reports in the press and possible notices through your door as we enter the next phase. The developers will be organising formal consultations in the area before they approach the government for approval of their planning applications.

The biggest undertaking of the Parish Council over the next few months is the provision of new play equipment in the park and Poors Meadow. This has been subject to delay due to red tape and tender constraints for the new equipment. This project has been spearheaded by Sharnford Parish Councillors; after many months of frustration we are seeing light at the end of the tunnel and all being well work should start in the spring.

This will be my last report as the Chairman of Sharnford Parish Council, having spent four years at the helm, which allowed time for a new elected Chairperson to have the confidence to fill the role.

SHARNFORD TRAFFIC ACTION GROUP (STAG)

DON'T BELIEVE EVERYTHING YOU READ IN THE NEWSPAPERS.....

Time and again we read that the average speed cameras have been switched off. After detailed discussions with Leicestershire County Council, we (STAG) can now give the truth behind the rumours and blatant distortion of the facts. The cameras have NOT

been switched off and are still recording speeds and licence plate numbers of the offending drivers. The only difference is, that sometimes, the offending motorists are not issued with fines.... this is down to the Magistrates Court time that would be needed to administer the collection of said fines and issuing of points on licenses.

If speeding drivers want to take the chance and play Russian Roulette with their driving licenses, then carry on. It is noticeable that when the papers mistakenly advertise that cameras have been switched off, speeds through the village increase, but not as much as before the cameras were installed.

Complaints have been received by STAG and Sharnford Parish Council that the speed cameras are just there to fleece the poor motorist out of their hard-earned cash, and this is the reason why the speed display signs have been covered over. This is not the case, according to Leicestershire County Council, the signs have been covered over and STAG's own speed monitor removed to see what effect the average speed cameras have on their own. It is also worth noting that the county, district, and parish councils do not receive any revenue from the fines imposed on the poor driver who cannot keep their right foot off the accelerator, all money goes to the treasury.

THE SHARNFORD GOOD NEIGHBOUR SCHEME



The Good Neighbour Scheme continues to be well utilised, and we are able to help and support our community at times when they most need it, thanks to our team of very dedicated volunteers.

Here's a quick reminder about what the scheme provides:

OFFERING SHORT TERM HELP TO ANYONE IN THE VILLAGE, WHO FROM TIME TO TIME MIGHT NEED SOME ASSISTANCE

What sort of support is provided?

The support is provided by a group of local volunteers within the village, and includes:

- Assistance around the house and home, for example: light gardening duties, small DIY jobs, cleaning, cooking a meal, shopping, help with letters and correspondence, or you may just want a friendly face to talk to occasionally. Whilst some jobs may be deemed too big, it is rare that we say no to smaller jobs i.e. you may just need a light bulb changing, or a picture hanging.
- We can also provide lifts for essential appointments such as doctors, hospital or dental appointments, again for times when you have no one else to call upon.

Essentially it's there for when friends and family aren't available, or if your circumstances change, for example, if you have just returned from hospital, or perhaps recovering from an illness.

Please note the scheme isn't just for older people, we can provide support to anyone who is over the age of 18

Is there a charge for the support?

The support is provided free of charge by the volunteers, except for lifts, when there will be a charge to cover petrol expenses, for example, a lift to Hinckley and back is £3.00. We will always tell you in advance how much a journey will cost.

Who should I contact if I need support?

To request support please call our dedicated phone number: **07502 615535** to speak to the Good Neighbour Scheme Co-ordinator. They will then find a volunteer to help with your request, and call you back to confirm who will be providing the support. Please note all our volunteers will be wearing an identity badge.

SHARNFORD AND THE BATTLE OF WATERLOO

Did Sharnford have anyone present at the battle of Waterloo? The schoolboy in me decided it was time to do some research. This battle which took place on Sunday 18th June 1815, in present day Belgium, between the Duke of Wellington's Angloallied force and the French army of Napoleon Bonaparte. It was to be the last of 23 years of successive battles which swept across Europe, and once and for all saw the end to Bonaparte who was to be exiled to the isle of St. Helena.

My research led me to bring Sharnford's 'olde' soldiers back to life, a lost world where Leicestershire young men spoke in their own village dialects that left the recruiting sergeants scratching their heads. To the left of both pages is a sampling of Leicestershire villages from where the young men took the King's shilling for George III (1760-1820) was on the throne. See how you fare with unscrambling the village names – they are but a few I have taken from the recruiting attestation books between the years 1755-1820. If you consider that 200 years ago very few people in their entire lives travelled more than twenty miles from their home village, and so developed a strong dialect which differed from village to village. Couple this dialect with a recruitment sergeant's phonetic spelling it produced some splendid malapropisms. Have fun.

Sharnford can lay claim to only having one man present at Waterloo. The 1861 census for the village reveals that a **John Forryan**, pensioner of the Grenadier Guards. Checking the Out-Chelsea pensioner records we find**Jns. Fooryan**, (sic.) Sergeant, 3rd.Battalion Grenadier, 1st Regiment of Foot Guards. War office document WO116/59 tells us that **John Forryan** was a Waterloo veteran serving with the Grenadier Guards – Sergeant Armourer – served a total of 43 yrs. 5 months. Received 2s.9d. per day in pension and retired 9th December 1851 to Sharnford.

John was 35 yrs. old when he fought at Waterloo and we know from the 3^{rd} . battalions service record that there was 29 officers and 818 men present on that fateful day18th. June 1815. The 3^{rd} . Battalion actually fought two battles in three days – a fierce encounter on the 16^{th} .June at Quartre Bras as well as Waterloo. The two battles produced heavy casualties within the battalion

John Forryan died 19 Jan: 1862 and was buried in St. Helen's churchyard 23 Jan: 1862 aged 82 yrs.

Right.....the Waterloo medal as given to the veterans - faces and reverse shown. The name the recipient of the medal was engraved on the edge. Looking at the surrounding villages I was



able to locate other Waterloo veterans with Cosby **providing** (1) – **Jno. Bingley**; Croft (1) –**Jno. Morton**; Stoney Stanton (1) –**Thos. Holmes**; Sapcote (1) **Thos. Bray**; Claybrooke (1) – **Josh. Scotton.** Hinckley provided the largest contingent (7) **Wm. Cully; Wm. Beale; Stephen Brookes; Michl. Goldsby; Wm. Woodward; Nathl. Smith** and **Jno. Lower.** We do have three interesting Sharnford young men that served in the Wars although unfortunately not present at Waterloo - **John Callington**; **Richard Bailess** or **Baileys** and **Joseph Carter.**

....oOo....

John Callington of Sharnford took up residency at the home of the Chelsea Pensioners (that cared for invalided and infirm destitute old soldiers) when he was 37 yrs. old -11^{th} Nov: 1817. His army service life spanned 12 yrs. 10 months during which time he received a severe wound described as 'wounded thro the breast'. Probably he was of small stature for he served in the 31st. Light infantry - a fast moving, always to the front, skirmishing and softening up the enemy engagement. His regiment was present prior to a general through the Portuguese and the Spanish Peninsular campaigns from 1808 to 1814, mostly under the command of the Duke of Wellington. John Calligton's early life is something of an enigma for we know little of his past. We know that he was born about 1780, a framework knitter, and was buried at Sharnford 17th July: 1859 aged 78 yrs.

Joseph Carter was yet another Peninsular veteran – who was also to become a Chelsea Pensioner. Christened at St. Helens 27 Apr: 1778, he was the second eldest child of five to Thomas and Mary Carter. By profession a woolcomber, he finishing his military service in 1815 with the 31st. Buckinghamshire Regiment after serving 13 yrs. and 5 mths. His record shows that he was to become unfortunately 'blind from Ophthalmia' – all his travails and misfortunes for a pension of the princely sum of 1/3d. (6½p.) per day.

...000....

Another occupant of the Chelsea Pensioner's home was Sharnford born Richard Bailess or Baileys. His date of residency at the home 1 June: 1807 when he was 56 yrs. of age. Prior to service in the 19th. Dragoons, in Sharnford he was a ribbon weaver. The 19th Dragoons served exclusively in (then) British India until 1806. He served 28 yrs. in India. After his admission to the home, on his record it simply states 'worn out'.

....oOo....

Sharnford would have been a prime location for recruitment being on a busy major turnpike between Leicester and Coventry. With the Bluebell and the Star pubs facing each other across the street – an ideal spot for the recruiting sergeant to set up shop. It wasn't as difficult to get enlisted as you may think – for recruiting parties scoured the county constantly – the party getting a bounty for any enlistment they made. And they were not overly fussy about who they took. In Sept: 1790 they took Richard Julius Caeser Hutchins of Leicester who was just 10 yrs. old.

....oOo....

The four young men shown below from Sharnford enlisted in the Royal Marines. They give me some of the earliest recorded young men from the village that joined the services that I can find. Luke Marvin, gardener, enlisted 4 Dec: 1766 age 19 yrs. Luke was the 7th. child of 11 children of Wm. & Anne Marvin. John Johnson, butcher, enlisted 20 May: 1780 age 34 yrs. John Smith, carpenter, enlisted 3 Dec: 1782 age 17 yrs. John Ils(t)on, framework knitter, enlisted 3 Dec: 1812 age 17 yrs. The Ilston family appear regularly in the parish

Overseer of the Poor book receiving small cash payments beginning 1807. John was the 3rd. child born to John Illston & Mary Murby.

....oOo....

In the course of my searches I came across this interesting old soldier. John Atkins of Ullesthorpe, participated in the 1745 Jacobite Rebellion (in which Bonnie Prince Charlie laid claim to the English throne). He was a soldier in Lord Fielding's company in the volunteer regiment of Lord Bedford. In later life, of John Atkins it was written.....'has been employed in the useful occupation of preparing, and vending at the different market-towns in this neighbourhood, a never failing mixture for the destruction of rats'.

....oOo....

Another of interest from the 1861 census we read Thomas Johnson, a 'discharged soldier', of Sharnford. He is a boarder at George & Mary Hanes Sharnford grocery shop at the time of the census. Lastly...... The oldest mentioning of a Sharnford man who did military service was Edwarde Gilberte. The parish records read 'Edwarde Gilbert was pressed & wente to serve the Kinge for the towne of Sherneforde the 12th. Day of December 1624. By me Alan Washington, rector ibidem'. Note the word pressed!

How did you fare with unscrambling the Leicestershire village names?


The time around Christmas


