What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and will prioritise are the following in February 2024.

Priority 1: Road Safety

You said: That Road Safety issues are your number 1 concern.

What we are going to do: Targeted speeding enforcement operations and issuing Traffic Offence Reports (TORs) where appropriate.

Priority 2: Antisocial Behaviour (ASB)

You Said: Anti-Social Behaviour including use of motorbikes was an issue to you.

What we are going to do: Targeted patrols of hotspot locations as identified by local residents. If perpetrators are identified then appropriate action will be taken.

Priority 3: Nuisance Motorbikes

You Said: Nuisance Motorbikes was an issue to you:

What we are going to do: The beat team will be monitoring reports of nuisance motorbikes throughout the Fosse Villages. When reports are received we will carry out enquires to identify perpetrators and take appropriate actions to disrupt them.

What we are doing

Priority 1: Road Safety:

- Due to operational commitments no speeding operation has taken place this month. One will be arranged in due course weather permitting. Please keep an eye out on social media as a speeding operation will be planned in the near future. If there are any areas of concerns you want us to target please get in touch.

Priority 2: Antisocial Behaviour (ASB)

- There has been reports of vehicles causing a nuisance at Stoney Cove in Stoney Stanton and on Brindley Close. Enquires are on-going to identify the perpetrators. Once they have been identified they will be dealt with appropriately

Priority 3: Nuisance Motorbikes

- As of 03/04/24 There have been 2 reports of the use of nuisance motorbikes in an anti-social manner the beat team are monitoring and conducting patrols of known hotspot areas. When suspects are identified they will be dealt with appropriately. Should you have any concerns about please let your beat team know.

News



Anti-social behaviour is defined as 'behaviour by a person which causes, or is likely to cause, harassment, alarm or distress to persons not of the same household as the person' (Antisocial Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014).

There are three main categories for antisocial behaviour, depending on how many people are affected:

Personal antisocial behaviour is when a person targets a specific individual or group.

Nuisance antisocial behaviour is when a person causes trouble, annoyance or suffering to a community.

Environmental antisocial behaviour is when a person's actions affect the wider environment, such as public spaces or buildings.













What your beat team has been up in the past month:

- Recovered an untaxed vehicle which was causing an obstruction to the road after community intelligence was received.
- Targeting areas which have been identified by the community as local hotspots for anti-social behaviour.
- A beat surgery was held at Stoney Stanton Library so the beat team could listen to community concerns.
- Engaged with local youths after issues were raised about offroad motorbikes being used in an anti-social manner.
- Assisted response colleagues with several incidents across the local area.
- Reviewed community intelligence that has been received so that further action can be taken.
