#### HINCKLEY NATIONAL RAIL FREIGHT INTERCHANGE

#### Start of rail freight hub examination

The Planning Inspectorate will start its examination of the Hinckley National Rail Freight Interchange scheme on 12 September. The examination into the 662-acre scheme, earmarked for rural land south-west of Elmesthorpe, will take around six months. The process starts with what is termed the Preliminary Meeting, scheduled for 12<sup>th</sup> September, to be held at the Leicester Tigers Conference and Events Venue at Welford Road in Leicester.

This will be a public meeting and anyone who has registered their interest in being involved in the HNRFI examination process is entitled to attend. People will also be able to join the meeting on Microsoft Teams if they can't attend in person.

The meeting will discuss procedural matters only and these will include a schedule for the examination process, deadlines for various formal submissions and topics to be covered.

Anyone wishing to attend in person or speak on the procedural matters during the meeting must register with the Planning Inspectorate by Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> September. People will also need to register if they intend to speak while using Teams, however, they don't need to register if they just want to watch the meeting online. Whether they attend or not, interested parties will then be sent details of how to take part in the examination.

Blaby District Council is already preparing its Local Impact Report and Written Representation, estimated to be due early October. These will outline significant concerns with numerous aspects of the scheme. Previous representations have stated the Council believes developers, Tritax Symmetry, have failed to sufficiently mitigate against the negative impacts the development will have on elements such as highways, landscape, ecology, noise and light, air pollution and, specifically, extended downtime at Narborough level crossing.

Councillor Terry Richardson, Leader of Blaby District Council, said: "We are now heading into a critical time for this development when the scheme's plans are looked at in detail. As a Council we are spending a significant amount of time and effort in ensuring we are able to make reasoned and sound responses on any aspects which are of concern. As part of our commitment we are engaging a number of specialist consultants to scrutinise the plans, bringing a raft of expert opinion to bear. "We will continue to respond and challenge in a timely and robust manner and I would urge all interested parties to take the opportunity to attend meetings, either in person or online, and ensure they speak up and make their own responses and voice any concerns. This examination period offers the chance for us to speak out on any elements with which we may take issue. "For more information visit:

#### **BLABY DISTRICT COUNCIL**

Households in Blaby District could benefit from a £6.8 million Government funding boost to help make homes more energy efficient.

The Home Upgrade Grant funding is targeted at households with the most inefficient heating systems which may also emit the most carbon emissions. It aims to support a range of enhancements. These could be large scale such as insulation, heat pumps or replacement doors and windows or smaller scale measures like smart heating controls or LED lighting. All

heating controls or LED lighting. All bring the benefit of improving the warmth and comfort of homes, while also reducing energy bills and making homes greener. Households must meet one of the following

criteria to be eligible for the funding:

 Have no mains gas for primary heating, using other sources such as electric, oil. LPG or solid fuel

- 2. Be in a priority neighbourhood postcode
- 3. Have an annual household income below £31,000
- Have a household member on certain benefits

Leicestershire County Council has received the funding on behalf of Green Living Leicestershire. This is a partnership between Leicestershire authorities, including Blaby District Council, who work together on sustainable and net zero projects. The new two-year scheme follows previous funding delivered through the Warm Homes service or Green Living Leicestershire partnership.

Cllr Les Phillimore, Blaby District Council Portfolio Holder for Housing, Community and Environmental Services, said: "These grants are designed to help people whose homes may be the coldest and dampest. Not only do they help make homes warmer and more comfortable but greener too. "Families benefit from reduced fuel bills and we benefit from reduced emissions. This supports our target of the District becoming carbon neutral by 2050. I would urge anyone who thinks they may be eligible to find out more." #### HIGHCROSS DISTRICT COUNCILLORS REPORT

Our feet haven't touched the ground since being elected in May, to represent the new District Ward of Fosse Highcross. The ward is made up of Aston Flamville, Elmesthorpe, Sapcote, Sharnford, and Wigston Parva, and we are so fortunate to represent all residents. Apart from the training sessions of over 10 x 2 hours each, and more to follow, we have attended over 20 meetings, covering subjects as diverse as Planning, to Online Abuse and Intimidation. Below is a list of a few things we have been up to:

#### **Fly Tipping**



We have noticed a large increase of fly-tipping over the last few months, this is a constant battle between the police and Council stopping illegal dumping of waste. We met with the Police and Crime Commissioner — Rupert Matthews and investigated ways in which we can all work together in catching and preventing fly-tipping. We have reported multiple fly-tipping sites, ensured these were collected by the Council and worked to get preventative measure in place.

#### Hinckley National Rail Freight Interchange (HNRFI)



The HNRFI proposals continue to take up lots of our time, especially at Blaby District Council (BDC). We have helped shape the first response document and the relevant representation. We joined other Fosse Villages Councilors to work up a plan of action to challenge the HNRFI proposals. Only recently we joined Alberto Costa MP and Dr Luke Evans MP on a conference call with

the planning inspectorate to share our concerns on the process. Our work with officers at BDC will continue and the next documents to be submitted will be the written representation and local impact report documents.

The Planning Inspectorate have now published the Rule 6 Letter (56 pages long) providing further details of the Preliminary Meeting and the proposed timetable for the Scheme's examination. The Preliminary Meeting, which is the start of the 6-month long examination process, is scheduled for 12<sup>th</sup> September 2023

# SHARNFORD HISTORY A DAY AT ST. HELENS CHURCH



It is Sunday.....the 25<sup>th</sup> February 1844. It is unseasonably mild for late February here in Sharnford. London and the South have endured thick fog from the 22<sup>nd</sup> February but today (the 25th.) it is beginning to clear.

The village parson, **Rev. Joseph Cotman**, (1769-1850) Rector of St. Helen's Church, Sharnford, leaves his home and walks the few steps from the Rectory to his adjacent church. He is going to have quite a busy day today especially for, perhaps, an arthritic 75 year old widower- as apart from the usual Sunday morning and evensong services - he has a burial and two families with seven children to christen. It was normal, back in those

days to baptise, bury, and marry on almost every day of the year (extremely popular for marriages and christenings was Christmas time).

The church interior is dank and cold, and the **Rev. Cotman's** thoughts quickly turn to a hot welcoming Sunday roast to be shared with his son **John**, the village's wine merchant - at the Rectory, that would be prepared later by their servant and cook - **Martha Furbrow**. (more on Martha later).

**Above -** Somewhat askew - the St. Helen's tombstone of the **Rev. Joseph Cotman** and his second wife **Jane (Gray) -** 1790-1838. They married at Holy Trinity church, Coventry 7 May 1817. His first wife **Caroline (Barratt)** died in 1816.

The funeral will be for 77 year old Sharnford born Isaac Aldridge, and will be especially poignant for our Rector. He would have known Isaac way back to 1799 when Joseph first arrived here to take up this clerical appointment, from Langham St. Mary in Norfolk where he was ordained as a priest 22 Dec: 1793.Below- from St. Helen's baptismal parish records Sunday 25 Feb: 1844- the Lapworth and Buckingham families. They were both cordwainers by trade (experts in leatherwork) and undoubtedly were good friends and they are the only christenings that day.


Thomas and Elizabeth Lapworth's three children ....William (6), John (3), James (1) are present. Thomas and Ann Buckingham's four children ...Richard (3), Joseph (1), and new-born babies Elizabeth and Ann are also present. I do not envy the Rector undertaking the ceremony of baptizing and naming of the children. The seven children are cold, upset and not understanding what is happening. Possibly the Rector has taken them all as a one job lot, the sentience of long years in the church has made him immune to their raucous presence.

The mechanics of researching history into a Sharnford family are a joy to me - especially if I find something of unique interest. Looking at one of our Christening families - the Buckinghams - it did not disappoint. Here (below) the Sharnford Buckingham's wedding Banns of 16th February 1837. It was the maiden name of new wife Ann - a Furbrow that caught my interest . Note also a witness at the wedding - Jane Furbrow. Wasn't the Rector Cotman's



cook a **Furbrow**? Indeed it was - **Martha.** How are they related?

The **Furbrow's** were a Sharnford farming family. To the parents John and Mary



Furbrow were born 12 children - 11 of these were female and one boy **John** (1816)who died in infancy.

The girls were Ann (?); Susan (1813); Jane (1814); Sarah Mary (1815); a double baptism of Rebecca and Martha (1817) - who both died in infancy. Another Martha (1818)- this is our cook at the Rectory. Mary (1820); Rebecca (1821); another Rebecca (1822; ) and lastly Eliza ((1823) who lived only a few days.

**Here right** - how the ladies dressed for best by the middle 1840's. This was in the age of the novelist Bronte sisters.



What of cook Martha Furbrow? With the death of the Rev. Joseph Cotman in June 1850 (his second wife died in 1838) - the son John Carter Davidson Dove Cotman (that's a bit of a mouthful!) - had to vacate the Rectory. Arriving from a Curacy at Bexhill, Sussex - Henry Lacon Watson who was inducted and elevated to Rector of Sharnford 14<sup>th</sup> Dec: 1850. He brought his household with him -Maria, his wife, his wife's

sister, his brother - and cook Helen Peck.

It was now an opportune moment for **Martha** (outgoing cook) to depart, to marry and to have her own home . **Below**- the marriage at St, Helen's church of **Martha Furbrow** to **William Aldridge** Sunday 30 Mar: 1851.

**Martha** knew **William** for several years - as he may have worked as a labourer for the Rector or perhaps rented Glebe land to farm himself. (Glebe land belonged to the benefice of the parsonage - was often farmed or rented out by the Rector to cover his stipend (living expenses).



There now appears to be a down turn in their circumstances - for we now see in the 1891 census, William and Martha living in Little Harrowden, Northamptonshire. William is now described as an 'agricultural labourer' - at the age of 73. He died in 1896. It was not a happy ending for Martha - for she died alone, a widow, and a pauper (meaning that the church burial tax could not be paid) at Little Harrowden, Northants in 1905 at the age of 87 years.
